Program Notes on some songs (1st Half)

Life is a Cabaret- "... come here the music play!" **Fugue for Tinhorns** – Three gamblers (aka "tinhorns") disagree over which horse will win today's race.

Watch What Happens – In 1899, when poor homeless & orphaned newsboys ("newsies") strike over owner Joseph Pulitzer's raising the price of his newspapers, a female reporter decides to cover the strike to be taken more seriously.

Marry the Man Today – Two women try to figure out how to get their men to commit to their respective relationships.

Agony – Cinderella's Prince and Rapunzel's Prince compare notes on their difficulties in courting their Princesses.

Little Girls – Miss Hannigan, keeper of an orphanage for girls, vents her frustration over being surrounded by them - All Day!

Tonight at Eight – She worries about her dinner date "tonight at 8". In our second half, He has the exact same worries.

When You're Home – Benny reassures a distraught Nina by taking her on a walk through the neighborhood to remind her of their childhood memories & the importance of being home.

Anybody Have a Map? – Two Moms share the struggles of parenting and connecting with a sullen, moody teenager.

Someone Like You – Lucy has fallen for Dr. Jekyll and pictures a life with him.

First Burn – When Alexander Hamilton – hoping to save his legacy – publicly admits to an extramarital affair, his wife, Eliza (sung by three women), feels shattered and betrayed by the revelation. Eliza's heartbreak and public humiliation lead her to take control of the story by burning the love letters Hamilton wrote to her – with her intention to "erase herself from the narrative" and from history.

Program Notes on some songs (2nd Half)

The New World – Even when everything seems stable and certain, there is "one moment" that can upend and change anyone's life.

Speechless – Princess Jasmine decides she is going to stand up for what she believes in. She knows it may not be easy and she may lose the fight, but she needs to step up.

Tonight at Eight – He worries about his dinner date "tonight at 8". *In our first half, she had the same worries.*

Stars – Javert vows to recapture (the innocent) Jean Valjean.

Do You Love Me? – A couple questions their long-term (arranged) marriage in tumultuous times when perceptions on love, matchmaking, and marriage are rapidly changing.

In a Crowd of Thousands – Anya has amnesia and Dmitry is trying to help her remember her past and who she is.

Suddenly Seymour – Seymour and Audrey admit their mutual love and Seymour promises to protect and take care of her.

Dyin' Ain't So Bad – Bonnie describes how she can't live without Clyde.

I Love Betsy – Jack's Mom's dying wish ten years ago was that he must never marry because "no woman can love him as she did" but, as he says here in the opening number of this musical, I love Betsy.

Written in the Stars – Radames and Aida are in love but are doomed to never be together.

You Love Who You Love – Two women, both deeply in love with criminals, explore the challenges of loving an outlaw.
